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Student's Feedback on Curriculum (2019-20)

To conduct Student's Feedback on Curriculum during the academic year 2019-20, a questionnaire was designed by IQAC of Kokrajhar Govt. College. The questionnaire was distributed to the Under Graduate students (Major Course) 6th Semester. Since the students of Bodo Major have not submitted the questionnaire on curriculum therefore the analysis on the subject could not be done. A total of 160 Nos. of under Graduate students submitted their responses.

To get a neutral, unbiased and objective response from the respondents, they were not asked to write their names in the questionnaire. Moreover, the questionnaire was submitted by the students in a drop box provided by IQAC for this survey.

The questionnaire was prepared covering various aspects on curriculum in the College. All the questions in the questionnaire had five responses out of which the respondent was asked to tick the response which he/she considered to be the most appropriate. The responses were rated in the weightage 1 to 5 with the legends "Poor", "Average", "Good", "Very Good", and "Excellent" respectively.

The questionnaire submitted by the students to IQAC was analysed thoroughly and quantitatively by a committee members Dr. Roseline Basumatary, Assistant Professor of Economics and Smritimayee Sarma, Assistant Professor of Statistics, headed by Dr. Hemanta Kumar Das, Associate Professor of the Department of Assamese of the College. The committee took the utmost care in tabulating the various aspects of the questionnaires and finally plotted the ratings into comprehensive bar diagram by using MS- Excel. The bar diagrams were drawn with "No. of qualitative question" as abscissa and "Average response" as ordinate of coordinate system. The bar diagrams clearly illustrate performance of Kokrajhar Govt. College on curriculum.






2. Department of Botany:


3. Department of Chemistry:

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

4. Department of Computer Science:





5. Department of Education:





6. Department of Economics:





7. Department of English:





8. Department of Hindi:





9. Department of History:




Analysis: The students were satisfied with the syllabus of the course in relation to the competencies. However, and the students were not satisfied with the electives offered in relation to the technological advancements.

10. Department of Philosophy:





11. Department of Physics:





12. Department of Political Science:





13. Department of Statistics:





14. Department of Sociology:





15. Department of Zoology:





16. Department of Bengali:




